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SOLUTIONS OF SELECTED PROBLEMS Problem 36, p. 63 If $\mu(E_n) < \epsilon$ and $\sum_{n=1}^{\infty} \chi_{E_n} \in L^1$, then f is a.e. equal to a characteristic function of a measurable set. Solution: By Corollary 2.32, there exists a subsequence $\sum_{n=1}^{\infty} \chi_{E_{n_j}} \in L^1$ a.e.. Let $A = \{x : \sum_{n=1}^{\infty} \chi_{E_{n_j}}(x) > 0\}$. For $x \in A$, $\{\sum_{n=1}^{\infty} \chi_{E_{n_j}}(x)\}$ is a sequence of 0's and 1's, so its limit can be either 0 or 1.

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
